

# A FROG'S LIFE



Match each frog picture on the left to the correct sentence on the right to learn about the development of a frog. Then circle people at the bottom of the page that might work with frogs.



12 Weeks: It now looks like a frog, but still has a stubby tail.



The female lays eggs in the spring. A group of fertilized eggs is called a spawn.



Tadpole 7-10 Days. They begin to swim and feed on algae.



6-9 Weeks: Legs and arms begin to grow. They eat insects.



20 Weeks: The frog is fully grown and spends most of its time out of water. Frogs live between 4-15 years.

4 Weeks: Skin grows over the gills. Little teeth appear. A coiled gut develops to help digest food.
